Junior High Trips

7th-9th grade

Junior high sites are specifically geared to match the exuberance and skill level of junior high students entering seventh grade through graduated ninth graders.

Junior/Senior High Mixed Trips

7th-12th grade

Mixed junior and senior high sites are designed for groups working with a wide spectrum of grade levels. These sites are open to teenagers entering seventh grade through graduated seniors.

Senior High Trips

9th-12th grade

Senior high sites offer an array of opportunities geared to the capabilities of senior high students. These are eye-opening sites that will challenge your teenagers entering ninth grade through graduated seniors.

What is the cost?

The cost of a YouthWorks mission trip varies by community and is listed on the previous pages. Cost per participant includes housing, meals, project supplies, site leadership, a t-shirt, and promotional, preparation, and debriefing materials. Depending on your specific site, there may be an additional \$10 per person evening activity fee, which you bring with you on your mission trip.

When are the trips?

Trips run from Sunday afternoon to Friday morning with four full days of ministry. Trips begin the week of June 8th and run weekly through August 3rd. We are also offering Family Mission Trips, which start Sunday afternoon and end Thursday morning. Visit our website to learn more about Family Mission Trips.

Can our adults go?

Your adult leaders play a vital role as they serve alongside your teens. Because our trips are geared toward youth, we ask that you only bring one adult for every seven high school students and one adult for every five junior high students or mixed age group. YouthWorks also requires that if you bring students of both genders, you have accompanying leaders of both genders.

Who leads our trip?

Your mission week will be led by four YouthWorks summer staff living in the community the entire summer. They are responsible for everything including food, housing, ministry opportunities, work projects, and supplies. They will also lead evening activities and programming.

What about other groups?

Unless your group reserves the entire week, there may be other groups signed up for the same week. Your youth will be divided into small teams and joined with students from other groups to do ministry. An adult from your group will always be with your students.

How do we get there?

Each group is responsible for their own transportation to and from the mission site location, as well as throughout the mission week. Refer to the website for specific transportation information for each community.

What is your bus policy?

Bus accessible mission sites are locations that have been designated as conducive for handling a bus. These sites have ample parking and ministry sites and that are easily accessible by bus. If a mission site is designated as bus accessible, YouthWorks requires that you provide additional transportation for participants at various ministry sites, as well as for emergency purposes. Please call the Service Center for more details.

Where do we stay?

Groups are housed in a local church, school, community building, or at a YouthWorks housing facility. Participants need to bring their own sleeping bags, pillows and pads that are twin size or smaller. All male and female participants (youth & adults) sleep in separate sleeping areas.
